Comments on “The Blessed Hope and Math”

Commentary

In 1993 I had the opportunity to visit Israel as a tourist after graduating from the Library School at University of California at Berkeley. When I was a Lutheran, I had read the King James Version Bible cover to cover, and became a Catholic in Berkeley at NEWMAN HALL at Dwight and College on Easter 1987.

Now, I knew from reading ACTS 1 that Messiah Jesus Christ will return to the Mount of Olives from where He left at the Ascension. (ACTS 1:9 says “he was lifted up before their eyes in a cloud which took him from their sight.”) Every Christian knows that only God knows the time of the Second Coming of Christ, except for those wild ones who try to set a date or gather on a mountain for the Arrival.

Jesus said this very clearly. (In the New American Bible, the phrase "But of that day and hour" refers to the timing of the Second Coming of Christ and the end of the world.) It is primarily located in two famous passages: [1, 2].

[1] Matthew 24:36 “As for the exact day or hour, no one knows it, neither the angels in heaven nor the Son, but the Father only.”

[2] Mark 13:32 “As to the exact day or hour, no one knows it, neither the angels in heaven nor even the Son, but only the Father.”

Jesus said at the end of (Matthew 28:20), “And know that I am with you always, until the end of the world!”

Now, we look at the seven last words of Jesus on the Cross. Here they are, the Seven Last Sayings.

1. **Father, forgive them, for they know not what they are doing.** *Luke 23:34*
2. **Today, you will be with me in paradise.** *Luke 23:43*
3. **Behold your son: behold your mother.** *John 19: 26-27*
4. **My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?** *Matthew 27:46; Mark 15:34; Psalm 22*
5. **I thirst.** *John 19: 28 (cf. John 4: 4-26); Psalm 22:15; Psalm 69:21*
6. **It is finished.** *John 19: 30*
7. **Father, into your hands I commend my spirit.** *Luke 23: 46; Psalm 31:5*

The purpose of the life of Jesus Christ is to give eternal life to all of humanity in the name of God. Notice even while Jesus is on the Cross, He mentions God’s name as Father or God four times. Pope Leo, the current Pope, mentioned in a General Audience on August 20, 2025 that Jesus offers a morsel of bread to his betrayer Judas Iscariot in one last attempt to demonstrate love. I do not know what the fate of Satan and the evil spirits is, but GENESIS 3:15 definitely refers to the Mother of God using her own bare feet to protect humanity as the Mother of Humanity. (The LORD GOD said to the serpent: “I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; He will strike at your head while you strike at his heel.” GENESIS 3:15)

Because the Jews have returned to Israel and the United States protects and defends the Jewish State, this opens the opportunity for the Messiah Jesus Christ to Return to the vacant Mount of Olives. As the prophet ENOCH said, “See, the Lord has come with his countless holy ones about him” and “But you, beloved, grow strong in your holy faith through prayer in the Holy Spirit. Persevere in God’s love, and welcome the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ which leads to life eternal.” (JUDE 14, 20-21)

We must always remember that Jesus Christ told us not to judge, lest we be judged. In American prisons there are Catholic Chaplains to visit condemned prisoners on their way to death. Also, do not forget that there are those in the BIBLE who escaped death or who were raised from the dead: Lazarus, Moses, Mary, Enoch, Elijah and there were some who were raised

from the dead after the Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Jesus is the lone individual in history who is the greatest name in this age and in the age to come and “Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever.” (HEBREWS 13:8) Jesus has all knowledge (except for the time of his return), and in as much as is mentioned in (JOHN 21:25): “There are still many other things that Jesus did, yet if they were written about in detail, I doubt there would be room enough in the entire world to hold the books to record them.”

Now it is time to say something about the capacity for humans to comprehend all knowledge. Until about 1700 A.D. it was possible for a well-educated person to be acquainted with all fields of knowledge. It has been said of the great Saint Jerome, 342 A.D.–420 A.D. Leibniz notation survives to this day as the way to do Calculus, where Newton’s notation is only used a little bit.
